



Grade 1 Assistant and Camp Teacher

Portland Waldorf School is welcoming applications for a full-time Grade 1 Assistant and Camp Teacher for the 2024-25 school year. Successful candidates will enthusiastically engage students and work collaboratively with colleagues to create an educational environment aligned with Waldorf pedagogy, our school mission, and program goals. We are seeking individuals who are committed to self-development, Anthroposophy, and Waldorf education.

Responsibilities:

- Grade 1 Morning Assistant: Support Teacher in day-to-day activities of class; supporting children through social interactions during indoor and outdoor play; general cleaning and tending of the classroom. Lead Grade 1 students during afternoon time.
- Grade 1 Afternoon Lead: Teach arts, crafts, or camp-like activities, and supervise outdoor play during the afternoon time.
- Camps: Lead vacation camps during school breaks and/or summer camps.

Requirements:

- Licensed with Oregon Central Background Registry.
- Experience in teaching a group of 20+ children in younger grades.
- Interest in learning about and commitment to teaching out of the foundations of Waldorf Education.
- Ability to engage with children, take direction from a Lead Teacher regarding classroom management, conflict resolution, communication, and day to day responsibilities.
- Good communication skills.
- Reliable, punctual, well-organized, and efficient.

- Waldorf Teacher Training (completed or in progress)
- Understanding of or experience in Waldorf education
- At least one year experience working with children in a group setting
